

# OUR HISTORY

Farnham Town Football Club is a senior level football club based In Farnham, Surrey, England.

Established in 1906 through the merging of Farnham Bungs (the Farnham Brewery) and the Farnham Star. The club was one of the founder members of the London Spartan League in 1975. They reached the Fourth Round of the FA Vase in the 1976-77 season and won the London Spartan League Cup in 1978 .

At the end of the 1979/80 season Farnham Town left the London Spartan League and applied to the Combined Counties League, their application was accepted and they finished 4th in their first season. The 1986/87 season saw Farnham take second place to Ash United in the league campaign. The glory days finally arrived in the 1990/91 season when the club won the league title. In the 1991/92 season, the Town got a clean sweep of the major trophies by winning the Combined Counties Premier League, the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Dan Air Challenge Cup. Having won the league, the club applied and were accepted to the Diadora League, however funds for necessary ground improvements could not be generated which resulted in the club not having a league to play in for the 1992/93 season.

In 1993/94 Farnham Town were accepted back into the Combined Counties League where they continue to ply their trade. From 1995-1998 Farnham finished in the top

six of the Premier Division for three consecutive seasons, in 1998-99 they finished in 13th position, then 10th in 1999-2000 before suffering relegation from the Premier Division in 2000-2001 season. They bounced straight back the following season but then endured four tough seasons back in the Premier Division, with bottom four finishes every season culminating in relegation back down to Division One in 2005-2006. Again, the club bounced straight back and in 2006-2007 they won the Division One title under the guidance of Barry Bridger, but were denied promotion due to the Memorial Ground not meeting the desired grading by the league. The club then spent another four seasons in Combined Counties Division One.

Farnham gained promotion from Combined Counties Division One in the 2010-2011 season after finishing second behind Worcester Park. In Paul Tanner's first season at the helm he gained automatic promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt, which after only retaining four members of the side from the previous year's squad - who finished mid-table, was quite an achievement. Paul Tanner's side also won the Combined Counties Fair Play Award for 2010-2011 after going the whole season without having a man sent off, a record to be proud of. In a very successful year for the club on the whole, Dean Nelson's reserve side finished second behind Mole Valley in the Combined Counties Reserve Division,



a record to be proud of. In a very successful year for the club on the whole, Dean Nelson's reserve side finished second behind Mole Valley in the Combined Counties Reserve Division, improving on fourth position the previous season. Farnham Ladies also finished second in their respective league to cap quite a remarkable season in Geoff Chapple's final season as Chairman. In 2011, Ray Bridger took over as chairman from Geoff Chapple.

The 2015/16 season saw the club lift the Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup whilst also reaching the final of the Aldershot FA Senior Cup

The 2017/2018 was ultimately one of disappointment to the club. A good start saw the club go on its best FA Vase run in decades, the defeat of higher league opposition in the County Cup and reaching 12th place on the back of a long undefeated run by early November. However defeat in the last minute of the FA Vase 2nd Round to Bridgewater Town marked a significant turning point and the club didn't win a single league match between 8th November and the season's end. This run led to the resignation of long serving manager, Paul Tanner, in February with first Paul Bonner and then Emmanuelle Boudine brought in to try and attempt to reverse the club's fortunes but alas it wasn't to be and The Town ended the season in last place and were relegated to the Combined Counties Division One. The one highlight of the latter half of the season however was the progression to the semi-finals of the Aldershot

Invitation Cup where they lost to eventual winners Hartley Wintney

Luke Turkington arrived as manager in the summer of 2018 along with Lee Pollard as his Assistant. There was little success in any of the cup competitions but in the league The Town made all the early running until hitting a sticky patch from mid-January until late February. The club recovered to finish the season strongly but with only 1 guaranteed promotion place this blip in form ultimately proved costly.

In the 19/20 season The Town were clear in 2nd place and looking certs for automatic promotion back to the Combined Counties Premier Division before the Covid pandemic struck and the FA decided to null and void the season. This decision saw Luke & his assistant move on to try their luck at a higher level with Alresford Town.

An extensive search with many high quality candidates interviewed saw The Town appoint the experienced and highly qualified Colin Millard as manager with long time servant of the club, Andy Sharratt, appointed as his assistant. The new gaffer has been able to keep the vast majority of last season's squad at the club and been able to strengthen it still further so hopes are high that the promotion taken from the club in 19/20 will be achieved this season

The Town welcome back supporters to the Memorial Ground, for the first competitive game since mid-March and the bumper crowd who turned up were treated to a late second half goal fest in a game that they could, and should, have won by a far bigger margin had it not been for an excellent performance from the visiting stopper.

Showing no signs of an FA Cup hangover, The Town took the game to the visitors and it wasn't long before Charlie Oakley had his first sight of goal when he hammered in a half volley only to see the keeper spread himself all Schmeichel-esque (Peter, not Kasper for our younger readers) to make a fantastic stop.

Matt Glass was next up with a shot at the far post well saved before Ben Bauchop hit one from just outside the box that was blocked and scrambled to safety. Other chances came & went and the home support went in at the break wondering if it was going to be one of those days where The Town would do everything but score.

Midway through the first half, The Town had a chance to take the lead when Charlie Oakley was bundled over in the

box. Matt Glass stepped up but saw his penalty well saved by an inspired visiting keeper.

A short while later however, The Town had another penalty as again Charlie Oakley was upended with a challenge that saw the visiting skipper given his marching orders for a second bookable offence. This time Darren Wheeler took over spot kick duties & made no mistake to give The Town the lead on 70 minutes.

From this point on it was all Town and on 83 minutes great work down the right from Matt Glass saw him put over a cross that found its way to Charlie Oakley to tap in at the far post.

Four minutes later it was game over as great interplay from Charlie Oakley & Romaine Atkinson saw the latter put through one on one with the keeper and a delightful lob made it 3-0

3 goals and a clean sheet was a great way to start the season and it's hopefully a sign of things to come in the months ahead

# KENSINGTON & EALING BOROUGH

## **HISTORY**

Established as A.F.C. Hillgate in 2012, the club joined the Middlesex County League. In 2013–14 they finished third in Division Two, earning promotion to Division One Central and East. After finishing sixth in Division One Central and East in 2014–15, they switched to Division Two of the Spartan South Midlands League. A fifth-place finish in 2015–16 saw them promoted to Division One. In the summer of 2016 they were renamed Kensington Borough. At the end of the 2016–17 season the club were moved to Division One of the Combined Counties League. At the end of the 2018–19 season, the club was renamed Kensington & Ealing Borough.

## **GROUND**

Having previously played at the Linford Christie Stadium in White City, the club moved to Avenue Park Stadium in Greenford for the 2015–16 season.[5] They moved to Spratleys Meadow in Amersham for the 2016–17 season and then to the Orchard in Bedfont for the following season.[6] Prior to the 2018–19 season the club relocated to Leatherhead's Fetcham Grove.[7] They moved to Grand Drive, home of Raynes Park Vale, in October 2019. Prior to the 2020–21 season the club agreed a groundshare with Hanwell Town's, moving to Reynolds Field in Perivale.

## 2 WINS FROM 2

Godalming Town 1 v 2 Farnham Town

They say that the mark of a good team is when they are able to win despite not being at their best, and The Town certainly showed that against Godalming in midweek.

It's fair to say that The G's didn't have the best 19/20 season and were looking odds on for relegation when the season was ended due to the coronavirus lockdown but they had looked a harder team to beat since the managerial appointment of Phil Ruggles and I guess could have argued that they may have turned it around and got out of the bottom 2. On Tuesday's performance it's clear that Phil Ruggles has used this break to make further improvements to his side and I doubt they will find themselves struggling this time round.

The G's were physical, pacey and closing down with intensity and it seemed to have an

unsettling effect on The Town players who never seemed to settle in to any kind of rhythm in the 1st half. The G's 2 wide men (Ogunseye and Osideko) in particular were causing all sorts of problems with their direct running at The Town full backs. It was no surprise therefore to see the home side take the lead & it was one of these players (Ogunseye) who was the scorer when a long punt upfield wasn't dealt with by Harry Oakley & Ogunseye stole in and lobbed Ossai in The Won net from just outside the penalty area.

The goal seemed to rattle The Town with passes going astray and cautions started to be picked up as frustrations grew. The half time whistle couldn't come soon enough & it was somewhat of a relief to The Town faithful when it did & we didn't find ourselves any further behind.

Thankfully the second half was a much improved performance from The Town as they adapted to Godalming's style & started to impose their own game on to the G's. Indeed, goal machine Charlie Oakley had a great chance within minutes of the re-start but his shot hit the side netting from a narrow angle.

It took until the 64th minute for The Town to draw level though when a cross was whipped in from the right hand side, bounced and eluded 2 Godalming defenders & their keeper before finding Charlie Oakley at the far post who leapt & nodded home from no more than a yard out.

6 minutes later & The Town were in front. There seemed little on when Max Meaton picked up the ball 30 yards from goal but he drove towards the penalty area, beat a couple of players before playing a delightful 1-2 with Charlie Oakley and smashing a shot at goal. It was straight at the keeper but the shot was too hot to hold & he spilled it directly in to the path of Charlie Oakley who had continued his run & who slotted it calmly between the keepers legs.

That goal really seemed to knock the stuffing out of the G's who only really picked up again as the game moved towards it closing stages but Ozzi only really had 1 good save to make in that period & he didn't disappoint.

It's been said elsewhere that The Town will play better than that and lose but 6 points from 6 gives us a great start to the season & a 100% start to Colin Millard's reign in the league


